DOWNING LECTURE



William "Bill" McArthur | NASA Astronaut

WILLIAM S. MCARTHUR, JR. is a retired United States Army colonel and NASA astronaut and a veteran of three Space Shuttle missions and one expedition to the International Space Station via the Russian Soyuz capsule, living aboard the station from October 3, 2005, until April 8, 2006. His first spaceflight

was in 1993, with subsequent missions in 1995 and 2000. A Master Army Aviator, McArthur has logged over 9,000 flight hours in 41 different aircraft and spacecraft.

McArthur is the recipient of several prestigious awards and honors including the Army Distinguished Service Medal, the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal (Oak leaf cluster), the NASA Distinguished Service Medal, the NASA Exceptional Service Medal and the NASA Space Flight Medal. He retired from the U.S. Army in 2001. Until his retirement in 2017, Bill served as the Director of Safety and Mission Assurance for the Johnson Space Center.

Bill is married to Cynthia with two daughters, and enjoys cycling, photography, and working with computers. In May 2009 he was awarded an honorary doctorate from the University of Strathclyde in recognition of his contribution to space science and engineering, as well as his outreach work with the Scottish Space School. He resides in Friendswood, Texas.
